

The New Town Hall (Rathaus I)

Turn around to see the New Town Hall (Rathaus), a building in the Maximilian style (Maximilianstraße, Munich), which was built in 1865. The newly renovated current Town Hall I, together with Town Hall II (a former boys' school) in Ringstraße 29 and the Old Town Hall provide the town's administrative seat. In Town Halls I and II, among other things, the artworks from notable Pfarrkirchen artists such as Hans Reiffenstuel, Prof. Hans Wimmer and Maria Theresia Ströbel can be appreciated.

Previously the fire brigade, the weigh master's office, the police and a school room were situated in this „magistrates' building“ along with the mayor's office. The building was financed through a special tax which became known as the „local malt tariff“ meaning that beer became more expensive.
